From the Rector's Desk:

The Rev. Michael B. Dangelo

Sunday, May 6th is a red letter Sunday in the history of the Church of the Redeemer. After many years of committee meetings, Vestry decisions, fundraising conversations, public appeals, design iterations, construction plans, renovations and waiting, the new Schoenstein organ will lead us in song and be blessed by the Rt. Rev. Alan Gates.

Alongside of this memorable moment (at the time of writing) over twenty parishioners will be confirmed in their commitment to Christ as Episcopalians, be received into the Episcopal Church or reaffirm their Christian faith and commitment to their baptismal promises. Sunday, May 6th will be a Sunday to beat the band!

A bishop's visit is a terribly important thing. Yes, it is a chance to see the rector sweat under the scrutinous eye of the Diocesan Bishop. But, more importantly, a bishop's visitation is the sign of the relationship we have as a parish with the ongoing life of the diocese and the larger Church of Jesus Christ. Bishops are a sign that what we do at 379 Hammond Street is connected to that larger organic work that the Holy Spirit is doing in places both near and far. Our bishops travel week-in and week-out visiting every parish in Eastern Massachusetts. They see big parishes and small parishes; thriving parishes and struggling ones. They see the work of God with a broad lens, and they bring the stories they hear of God's abiding love and mission with them to every parish they visit.

Bishops also bring with them the Church through the ages. We are 'The Episcopal Church' after all.

From our founding, our church has looked to the office of the bishop as a necessary and distinct cornerstone of its identity. The office of the bishop can be found in some of the oldest Christian texts like St. Paul's letter I Timothy. There we find the office of the bishop as overseer of the body of Christ whose ministry is to guide and nurture the Church like shepherds lead their sheep. (Ever wonder why the bishop carries a crozier? There ya' go!) And as Episcopalians, we hold that that office through the ages has been a guiding hand and connecting thread for Christians from city to city and nation to nation. When the bishop lays hands on those receiving confirmation, reception and reaffirmation, another link in a great chain stretching back to the apostles will be forged connecting us from age to age.

The bishop will also offer us a blessing and a challenge. With us he will give thanks for the hard work and dedication that made our new organ possible. And, he will remind us that the first purpose of such an instrument is to offer God our prayers and praise. But the second purpose is as important! This wonderful instrument is not just for the Redeemer. If used in a holy fashion, this instrument will be a point of invitation. Through it, we will invite our neighbors to experience the love of God in worship. Through it we will train the next generation of Redeemer children to know and love the great hymns of the Church and our extraordinary tradition of music. Like the bishop, the organ is our opportunity to forge new links with God's work in the world today and throughout the ages. Challenge and blessing, blessing and challenge these will be ours on May 6th.

From the Wardens

Fellow Parishioners,

Spring is arriving at the Redeemer and with it, the disappearance of snow mountains in the driveway and remnants of the magnificent Redeemer spruce which blew over onto the Old Parish house during one of our March Nor'Easters. Our celebration of the Passion and Resurrection of Christ during Holy Week and on Easter was joyous and beautiful and our Clergy, Musical Director, Choir, Altar Guild and Staff deserve our thanks for their work. Many Redeemer friends, old and new, participated in these powerful and moving services. Attendance was especially high this year for the Easter Sunday services.

Since the beginning of April, the assembly of the Schoenstein organ has been taking place in the Sanctuary. It is a pleasure to see the craftsmen at work, putting the puzzle pieces together that make up our organ. The workmanship is elegant; the new woodwork seamlessly matches the original Vaughn details. We eagerly look forward to hearing our new organ played in May.

The Vestry Meeting in April opened with a reading and study of Isaiah 43, a passage on God's love for us. Velura Perry gave a one year report on Fuel. During this past year, students from eight Newton schools have been served 862 backpacks of food from the Redeemer program. Snacks were provided to children in a Title 1 program during the summer. We are now working with the City of Newton to expand the program into additional schools. Velura and Redeemer volunteers are making an important difference to hungry children in our community. Please come to the Undercroft on a Tuesday afternoon to help load up backpacks or lend a hand in other ways.

The Nursery School which operates during the week downstairs in the Parish Hall, is closing this spring. The Rector, Wardens and Vestry are looking at best uses of our space and at what we, as a Parish, are being called to do, going forward. As part of that process, Steven Gerrard, Principal of Ann Beha Architects spoke to the Vestry about a comprehensive review of our campus, including a proposal to perform a Needs Assessment Analysis of our buildings. In the first part of this multi-phase process, his firm would study the condition of the church, the Parish Hall and the Old Parish Hall, determine upgrades required to meet current standards for mechanical, electrical, plumbing, fire and protection systems, roofing, structure, masonry and windows etc. The Vestry is reviewing the proposal and is expected to vote on it at its May meeting.

Bishop Alan Gates is coming to the Redeemer on May 6th for Confirmation, Reception and Reaffirmation. Bishop Gates will also be blessing the Schoenstein organ then. I was confirmed in the Episcopal Church many decades ago, while a teenager and will now be seeking Reaffirmation. It is heartwarming to see that eleven other adults will be joining me and our younger Confirmands before the Bishop.

We hope to see you at the Redeemer for the Bishop's visit on May 6th.



Our Annual Celebration this year is focused on Prophetic Hope. Our understanding of “Prophetic Hope” is the capacity to fully see the world’s brokenness alongside the hope of what God might create through us.

Summer Volunteer Opportunities

Again this July we will provide snacks for the Title 1 summer enrichment program. The Program Director is still working on the numbers, but last summer we provided snacks for 40 children. This year the program runs from July 2 - 26 for a total of four weeks, 18 days and three weekends for which we will provide any needed backpacks as well. We will need one or two people to make the initial delivery of water and snacks, requiring some heavy lifting. Then we will need 1-4 people to deliver fresh fruit every week. Backpacks will also need to be delivered, we think, but we won’t know the need until the program begins. *If you are interested in any piece or overseeing the summer program, please let me know.*

It is also very likely that the Redeemer will be involved in a summer backpack program in coordination with the City of Newton. When plans are finalized, our needs will be clearer. Certainly, *if there are young people, or others, who would be interested in helping to pack perhaps 200 backpacks in late June/early July, please let me know that as well.* This is an exciting opportunity for our parish, a chance to step up and build community among ourselves as well as with our neighbors in Newton.

**From Michael S. Murray,
Director of Music**

What an exciting few weeks it has been at Redeemer. The new Schoenstein organ arrived on Easter Monday!

If you haven't seen the blog that I created to follow the organ's construction, you should take a look at: <https://schoensteinop172.wordpress.com>

The blog is essentially a series of articles and archive of photographs documenting the fascinating design, construction and installation of the new organ.

This past week the organ's façade arrived and was installed, making the organ *look* complete. There is still much to do. The process of tuning, mechanical debugging, tonal regulation and the like will take many weeks. The organ will slowly come to life, but will have to suffer through with the temporary organ for a little while longer.

The process of tonal finishing is of vital importance. This is when each pipe (of the 1878 speaking pipes) are carefully checked for speech, loudness, and tone, in comparison to pipes of other stops to ensure the perfect marriage of complementary tone colour. This painstaking work will be carried out from May 7th until the job is done (most likely early June).


